









	Intent	<p>‘Start With A Story’ is our very first topic in school! This is the start of an exciting reading journey through Regent Farm. We begin with Traditional tales providing the children with motivating, hands-on experiences. The children are immersed in an imaginary world through role play, and interaction with themed resources. We build on initial story-telling techniques such as: verbalising and making story-maps to show our understanding. We also take time to settle the children into their new routine and help them familiarise with their new surroundings.</p>	<p>This half term the children are invited to use their senses to investigate light and dark. We will explore some new and familiar characters that challenge us to talk about our fears. The children will also learn about the changing season including differences in their immediate environment. We will discover which animals are local to our homes and which are getting ready for colder months ahead. Above all we will embrace the season through celebration and performance using role play, dance and music to express ourselves.</p>	<p>This half term we explore the contrasting worlds of fire and Ice! We will use the colder weather outside to explore ice and snow through multiple sensory experiences. We will delve into a Frozen world where we discover colder places, their inhabitants and investigate the properties of water in different states. We then move onto a world of fantasy and fire which will ignite our imagination and spark our interest in dragons. These mythical beasts will inspire our creative curiosity as we investigate shape and pattern in art.</p>	<p>Let’s Set Sail will take the children on an adventure into the world of pirates. As we dive into pirate school we will find similarities and differences between ourselves and the pirates. We will discover that some of our differences are what make us special. This half term the children are encouraged to develop their questioning skills and use determination to work through challenges based around the pirates.</p> <p>In the second part of the half term we will discover new life and find out what it means to take care of living things.</p>	<p>Miniature worlds will take us on an investigation of the world beneath our feet. The children are invited to develop their interests of different habitats and build on their knowledge of looking after living things. Spotting the signs of Spring will enable us to discover new life and how to take care of our beautiful world. We will become mini-beast explorers and learn where to find them in our outdoor classroom. We will find out what they need to survive and which mini-beasts are important for our gardens too!</p>	<p>This half term the children will explore their own sense of wellbeing. We will look at the relationships we have made this year and what makes us individual. We will focus on what makes a community and broaden our understanding of this through visits around the local area. During this half term we take the opportunity to consolidate learning through a range of new and familiar experiences. We continue to challenge the children and develop their skills so that they feel confident and supported during their transition to Reception.</p>
